IT IS ANTICIPATED THAT MEMBERS OF CITY COUNCIL AND OTHER CITY BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES MAY ATTEND THE MEETING IN NUMBERS THAT MAY CONSTITUTE A QUORUM OF SUCH OTHER CITY BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES, SO THAT NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT THE MEETING IS ALSO A MEETING OF THE OTHER CITY BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES WHOSE MEMBERS ARE IN ATTENDANCE. THE MEMBERS OF THE OTHER CITY BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES MAY PARTICIPATE IN DISCUSSIONS WHICH OCCUR AT THE MEETING, BUT NO ACTION WILL BE TAKEN BY THE OTHER BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES WHOSE MEMBERS ARE IN ATTENDANCE.

Ordinance No. 618 (09/20/10), Repealing Ordinance No. 593

At all City Council, City Commission or City Board meetings, the agenda shall include a "citizens to be heard" item. It is suggested that Citizens wishing to speak during this item sign in on the sign up roster prior to the meeting. During "citizens to be heard" comments, each individual may speak on an agenda item or any other matter affecting the city. In addition to the "citizens to be heard" portion of meetings, a person may make comments on agenda items prior to the vote on the agenda item. A member of the public will have a total of six (6) minutes to be heard during a City Council, City Commission or City Board Meeting. This does not include any responses from the body. The six (6) minutes time limit authorized herein may not be transferred to another speaker in whole or in part. The presiding Officer or his/her designee will assign a Time Keeper to each meeting. The Time Keeper will maintain strict compliance of the six (6) minute rule, stopping speakers who exceed the allotted time. As authorized by Section 551.042 of the Texas Government Code, the Presiding Officer may direct a City Official to make: a statement of specific factual information in

response to an inquiry made by a member of the public or of the City Council, or; a recitation of existing policy in response to an inquiry made by a member of the public or the City Council. Any deliberation of or decision about the subject of the inquiry shall be limited to a proposal to place the subject on the agenda for a subsequent meeting. Any question posed by a Citizen, Council Member, Board Member or Commission Member for which an answer is not available at a meeting shall be answered by a member of the staff or Presiding Officer at the next regular meeting of the Body, if an answer is reasonably available and prudent. If the information is sensitive, staff will seek advice from the City Attorney.

REQUEST ALL PAGERS AND CELL PHONES BE TURNED OFF, EXCEPT EMERGENCY ON-CALL PERSONNEL. CITIZENS ARE ASKED TO REFRAIN FROM TALKING DURING COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS.

Meeting Chair: please remind each participant in your meeting that they must speak into a microphone; the recording is the Official Minutes of your meeting and all who speak must be recorded. All guest speakers and citizens to be heard must speak from podium. Please interrupt speakers during meeting if you recognize that they are not speaking into microphone and have them do so.

II. Citizens to be Heard on Subsequent and Non-Subsequent Agenda Items

1. A member of the public will have three (3) minutes to discuss non-subsequent agenda items.
2. A member of the public will have six (6) minutes to discuss subsequent agenda items.

III. Discuss and Act

1. The WCCPD Board of Directors will review, discuss and may take action on the year end budget projections for FY 2012/2013 and the FY 2013/2014 proposed budget.

IX. General Announcements & Future Agenda Items Requested

Per Ordinance No. 618, repealing Ordinance No. 593; Section 9: Every agenda shall include an item entry granting a member the opportunity to propose an item for consideration of future agendas for Regular or Special Meetings. Any member may request the inclusion of such items at any meeting.

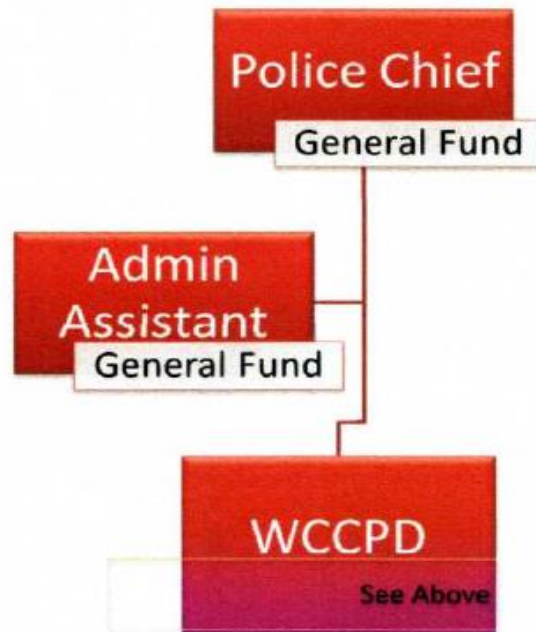

POLICE RADIO'S - MANDATORY COMPLIANCE FOR P25 RADIO'S IS REQUIRED BY DECEMBER 2015. LISTED RADIO'S FOR FY2013-2014 IN CONJUNCTION WITH 5 YEAR CIP PLAN WILL INSURE THAT THE WINDCREST POLICE DEPARTMENT IS READY AND IN COMPLIANCE WITH MANDATED REQUIREMENTS BY DECEMBER 2015.

HIGHLIGHTS

1. Driver arrested for DWI after almost hitting an officer in a patrol car head on. Suspect was driving southbound in the northbound lanes of I 35 N frontage road.
2. Robbery (Individual) occurred when a juvenile male riding his bike on Walzem Rd was pushed off his bike by another male and the bike was stolen.
3. Officer attempted to stop two subjects for a pedestrian violation. One subject began running away and was found hiding in a local business' loading dock. Another short foot chase ensued and the suspect was caught and booked for Evading Arrest
4. Officer observed a suspect break into a trailer. Suspect was arrested for Burglary Vehicle.
5. Subject arrested by officers after being involved in a disturbance and pulling a gun on another person. He was also found to be in possession of narcotics.
6. Officers arrested a subject for Burglary Vehicle after he broke into a vehicle in a business parking lot. All Property was recovered.
7. Subject arrested for Theft and Criminal Mischief after he ran from a store with a shopping basket containing stolen property. Officer arrived and the suspect pushed the cart into the police vehicle in a failed attempt to escape.
8. Two officers of the Police Department went into a burning house and rescued a resident from the fire.
9. Subject arrested for Criminal Mischief after breaking out a store window and was active on three Felony warrants.
10. Customer dining at a local restaurant left her camera and accessories at the table when she left. Returned a few moments later and found the bag gone. Security cameras checked and an employee was videoed taking the items. Property returned a few days later.
11. Police/Fire from Windcrest and San Antonio were at a Windcrest service station for over 3 hours when an 18 wheeler pulled into the property with a ruptured fuel tank.
12. Subjects were at a local restaurant and involved in a disturbance, the boyfriend jumped up and grabbed a pot of coffee to burn his girlfriend. Employees intervened and the boyfriend struck her over the head and fled location.
13. Driver stopped for traffic and arrested for illegal possession of Methamphetamines, marijuana, Hydrocodone, Xanax and was active on a probation violation warrant.
14. Driver stopped for traffic and arrested for illegal possession of marijuana, Hydrocodone and Xanax.
15. Driver stopped for traffic and arrested for illegal possession of Methamphetamines.
16. Subject arrested for assaulting his 13 year old niece while driving her to school.
17. Six subjects arrested for Criminal Attempt-Theft at a local business. One charged with possession of Heroin, One for possession of an altered identification, another for possession of multiple identifications in other persons names.

FROM THE CHIEF

The City of Windcrest normally has very few graffiti problems, however, the surrounding area affects us and we have a wide variety of traffic moving through Windcrest. Recently, there has been an increase in graffiti along Crestway from Randolph Blvd through Richfield. Graffiti is a serious property crime and creates even more problems when nothing is done about it. Graffiti is a direct drain on your tax dollars...money that could be used for other community improvements are used for graffiti clean up. Graffiti decreases a citizen's feeling of safety in their community. Property values may decrease and loss of business growth and tourism. Graffiti sends a message that nobody cares, which attracts other forms of crime and other delinquency to the neighborhood.



It is very important that all graffiti (tagging) be reported to the Police Department as soon as possible. We work diligently investigating graffiti crimes and identifying the suspect(s) responsible for the damage. After reporting graffiti to the police, it should be removed within 24-48 hours to help prevent further tagging. It is also very important to report all suspicious activity in your neighborhood or around your home. If you see anyone in the drainage areas around Windcrest, call the police and report it. It is against City ordinance to be in a drainage area.

The Windcrest Police Department treats all graffiti crime with zero tolerance and aggressively enforces the laws regarding it. We need your help to keep Windcrest graffiti free! Remember, graffiti (tagging) is not art...it is a crime!
